

Job Profile: Founding and Settlement Managers

In this profession, individuals are trained as **Founding Managers** – meaning they establish projects, businesses, or settlements on behalf of a person, organization, or community.

Stage 1 – Small Enterprise Founding

- Establishing small businesses, snack bars, interest groups with offices/meeting spaces.
- **Theory and Internship**

Example Theory Topics:

1. Horticulture / Gardening
 2. Snack bar with 3 employees
 3. Grocery store (village-scale)
 4. First aid association for sports events and hiking tours
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Stage 2 – Settlement Start-up Manager

Example Theory Topics:

1. Reconstruction after a natural disaster in cooperation with local authorities
 2. Restoration of natural lands after destructive events in cooperation with local authorities
 3. Conversion of abandoned mining sites into natural biotopes
 4. Conversion of abandoned mining sites into new settlements, up to handover to government structures
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Stage 3 – Genesis Manager

- Founding settlements in different environmental zones, up to handover
 - Planning and establishment of research stations (management focus)
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Stage 4 – Space Settling Management (*In Planning*)

Curriculum Overview

- **Project Assessment:** What is needed, what should be built
- **Requirements Analysis:** What resources, permissions, or equipment are needed (including permits with authorities)
- **Infrastructure Assessment:** Existing vs. required infrastructure

- **Company Coordination:** Managing suppliers, contractors, and client relationships
- **Inventory Preparation:** Stock required for project start
- **Environmental Integration:** Nature-implantations compatible with existing ecosystems

Settlement Planning:

- Supply and logistics
- Administration, education, and healthcare
- Community guidance / pastoral care
- Infrastructure development
- External relations (trade, supply networks)
- Capacity calculations
- Company interests and coordination
- Delivery and distribution
- Natural, social, and economic symbioses
- Biotope restoration and healing methods

Biotope Development:

- Hermetic / enclosed biotopes
- Underwater research station setup (theory)
- Desert research station setup (theory)

This concept is designed to be **politically and religiously neutral**, but includes environmental symbiosis management in all stages. Reconstruction and creation of biotopes are included.

Additional Clarifications

- Classical business founding skills are **prerequisite knowledge** but are not separately covered in the curriculum.
 - The focus is on **ecological, social, and infrastructural symbiosis**.
 - Graduates must be able to **justify and calculate critical limits** (e.g., population capacity, biotope preservation) and present them to leadership, but they do **not govern** or retain control over settlements.
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Supplementary Curriculum Points – Graduate Profile

Role of Graduates:

- Founding and settlement managers
- Responsible for establishing, restoring, or founding sites, settlements, or biotopes until they are taken over by local authorities or self-organized structures
- Not responsible for long-term governance, only **construction, restoration, and handover**

Curriculum Extensions:**Symbiosis Management:**

- Develop concepts for how humans, nature, and economy coexist at a location
- Biotope healing and integration (forests, wetlands, lakes, agricultural areas, urban ecosystems)
- Identify critical environmental, population, and resource limits
- Justify protection, conservation, or use restrictions

Capacity and Limit Planning:

- Calculate maximum population limits for new settlements
- Forecast sustainable supply capacity (food, water, energy)
- Produce reports as decision-making support for future mayors or administrations

Construction and Handover Competence:

- Structured planning up to operational functionality
- Handover to local authorities, administration, or self-organized groups
- Documentation and training of local actors
